1 The trick with the stick

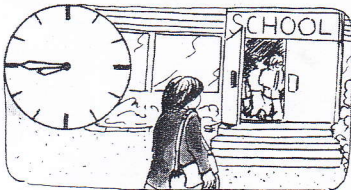
1. It is Saturday morning. At ten o'clock Ken goes (go) to the park with Bob. 2. In the park he teaches (teach) Bob a new trick with a stick. 3. Bob stands (stand) and waits (wait). 4. Then Ken throws (throw) the stick up into the air, and says (say) to Bob: "Get it, Bob! Get it!" 5. Bob watches (watch) the stick. 6. It flies (fly) up into the air, and then it comes (come) down. 7. Bob runs (run) to it, and carries (carry) it to Ken. 8. Ken says (say) "Good dog", and gives (give) Bob a biscuit. 9. Bob does (do) the trick again and again. 10. Now the box with the biscuits is empty. Ken throws (throw) the stick again. 11. Bob watches (watch) it. 12. But when the stick comes (come) down again, Bob sits (sit) down. 13. Then he runs (run) out of the park and goes (go) home.

2 Ben MacDonald's day



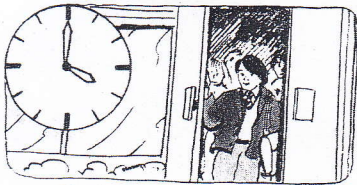
1. Ben: I get up at half past seven.

Ben gets up at half past seven.



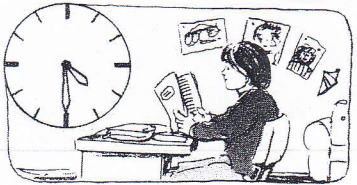
2. Ben: I go to school at quarter to nine

He goes to school at quarter to nine.



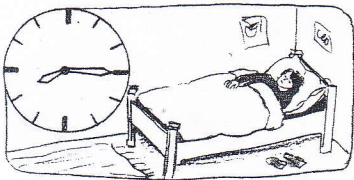
3. Ben: I leave school at four o'clock.

Kevin: Yes, I do, but our flat is too small. And my parents don't want a dog.
