When you give feedback, you should:



- Suse the table (don't write on it) + end of your English book.
- Take a sheet of paper and write your feedback to your partner's text on the extra sheet.

CONTENT

Your text is: interesting, funny, exciting.

quite good, alright, not really interesting

Your text is **easy to understand** and it was **easy to follow** your ideas. a bit difficult to ..., quite easy to ..., hard to ...

You **covered the important points** in the task.

didn't really cover ..., you forgot to cover ...

You gave answers to the **5 Ws** and **how**.

You forgot to give answers to the question ... / the questions ... and ...

STRUCTURE

You had a catchy / cool title.

Your title was OK, not really catchy, you forgot a title ...

You used **clear paragraphs** to structure your text.

You didn't use …

You **indicated your paragraphs** in the layout (by indenting the line – Zeile einrücken).

You didn't indicate ...

Your **first paragraph** said what the whole text is about (you **aroused** the reader's interest).

You didn't really tell the reader what the whole text is about.

Every **paragraph** has a **new idea**.

You started **every paragraph with a topic sentence,** which tells the reader about the **main idea** of the paragraph.

In the **other sentences** of each **paragraph**, you gave **details**, facts and examples for the paragraph's main idea.

You connected short sentences with **linking words** and **relative clauses** / **used contact clauses**.

You used **time phrases / lots of time markers** to show the **order** of **events**.

LANGUAGE

You used **different and cool adjectives** in your description of places, people and things.

You used **adverbs** for actions to make your text more interesting.


Your text had a **good**/interesting **ending** (**All in all, to sum it up / to put it in a nutshell ...**) in which you **summarized** the main idea / your **ending** of your **story was cool / surprising**.

You used **special vocabulary** for the topic.

Your **spelling** was **correct**.

Your **grammar** was **correct**.

Use the end of your English book too to write some special ideas.
